ORIGINAL PLACE NAMES OF CANADA

For National Indigenous History Month we wanted to recognize some of the many places in Canada that have names derived from our Onkwehón:we languages and take a look at their original meanings.

Canada - Kaná:ta

meaning "village" or "settlement" in
Kanyen'kéha (Mohawk)

Quebec - Kepék

meaning "strait" or "narrows" (Mi'kmaq)

Ontario - Kanyatarí:yo

meaning a "beautiful lake" in Kanyen'kéha
(Mohawk)

Saskatchewan - Kisiskatchewanisipi

meaning "swift flowing river" (Cree)

Toronto - Tsi Tkarón:to

meaning "a log submerged in water" in
Kanyen'kéha (Mohawk)

Saskatoon –

Manimisāskwatān

meaning "the place where willows are cut"
(Cree)

Oshawa – Aazhawe

meaning "the crossing place" in
Anishinaabemowin (Ojibway)

Manitoba - Manidoobaa

meaning "the narrows of the Great Spirit" in
Anishinaabemowin (Ojibway)

Ottawa - Adaawe

meaning to "buy" or "trade" in
Anishinaabemowin (Ojibway)

Winnipeg - Win Nipi

meaning "muddy water" (Cree)

Nunavut -

meaning "our land" in the Inuit
language of Inuktitut
