Help the Woodland Cultural Centre this June to win **\$10,000 in the Great Canadian Giving Challenge** to secure funding support needed for operational costs of the former Mohawk Institute Residential School

Woodland Cultural Centre is thrilled to participate in the Great Canadian Giving Challenge in the hopes of winning one of the grand prizes of \$10,000. WCC is aiming to secure funding support needed for the restoration project of the former Mohawk Institute Residential School building. The vision is to turn the building into an Interpretive Historic Site and Educational Resource, shedding light on a significant chapter in Canadian history.



As one of the few remaining Residential School

buildings within Canada and the only site in Ontario offering guided tours until undergoing closure for refurbishment, the Mohawk Institute stands as a living testament to the tragic legacy of the residential school system in the country.

In partnership with the Great Canadian Giving Challenge, a month-long fundraising initiative held each June, Woodland Cultural Centre invites donors to contribute through CanadaHelps.org or CanadaHelps fundraising tools. Every donation made between June 1st to 30th to WCC serves as an entry for a chance to win one of two \$10,000 prizes.

Marking decades of resilience, the former Mohawk Institute will emerge as a platform for truth-telling, healing, and reconciliation, commemorating the resilience of Indigenous children who endured the residential school system.

Through a multifaceted approach encompassing historical exhibitions, community engagement, and educational programming, Woodland Cultural Centre stands at the forefront of promoting Indigenous culture and fostering understanding among diverse communities.

As the Woodland Cultural Centre strives towards a Spring 2025 public reopening, our operational budget has faced some unforeseen financial hurdles necessitating communal support. Despite weathering setbacks from the pandemic, inflation, and logistics issues, significant progress has been made in critical endeavors such as elevator installation, masonry repairs, and accessibility ramp enhancements. The support of our giving community is vital for the future of the Cultural Centre.

History should be accurately recorded, archived and the best "Evidence" comes from a lived experience. The Woodland Cultural Centre had a very important, yet difficult job, ethically and morally, to ask survivors to relive childhood abuse and trauma. The gathering of evidence occurred over several years and through the collaborative efforts of the Woodland Cultural Centre, many survivors were able to have their truths documented and archived. The former school will now educate, not destroy.

"Save the Evidence" opened the doors for any and all survivors that were able to speak

about the horrific circumstances they were forced to endure during their time at the former Mohawk Institute Indian Residential School. Even though the Save the Evidence campaign has ended, according to a conversation I had with John Elliott "We are not done yet, there is more to tell" and as evidenced by the voices of the survivors, "We Are Still Here".

Nya:węh/Niá:wen to Ontario Trillium Foundation for granting \$73,100 from Resilient Communities Fund





Through this grant of \$73,100 over 12 months, the Woodland Cultural Centre will recruit and train new volunteers from Brantford and Six Nations who will help to leverage the organization's exceptional Indigenous arts and cultural programming and facilitate the delivery of more and larger events while building stronger community engagement.

The project will also provide new wellness supports for staff who deal daily with the highly emotional work of educating visitors about the traumatic events that took place at the former residential school where the Centre is located. These new supports will include both traditional Indigenous healing practices and contemporary wellness workshops which will increase staff job satisfaction, reduce burnout, and decrease staff turnover.


