## **Help the Woodland Cultural Centre this** GivingTuesday to Raise \$15,000 to support funding needed for operational costs of the former Mohawk Institute Residential School

This year, GivingTuesday will be Tuesday December 3rd, and the Woodland Cultural Centre (WCC) is asking you to help us raise \$15,000 for the reopening of the former Mohawk Institute Residential School as an Interpretive Historic Site and Educational Resource, shedding light on a significant chapter in Canadian history. The support of our giving community is vital for the future of the Cultural Centre.



### What is GivingTuesday?

GivingTuesday was created in 2012 as a simple idea: a day that encourages people to do good. It's now evolved into a movement that unleashes the power of radical generosity around the world. Giving Tuesday reimagines a world built upon shared humanity and generosity. Their global network collaborates year-round to inspire generosity around the world, with a common mission to build a world where generosity is part of everyday life.

### A Brief History of the Former Mohawk Institute



The Mohawk Institute Indian Residential School operated in Brantford, Ontario from 1828 to 1970. It served as a boarding school for First Nations children from Six Nations, as well as other communities throughout Ontario and Quebec. It served as a key tool in the effort to assimilate First Nations children into European Christian society, and sever the continuity of culture from parent to child.

After closing in 1970, it reopened in 1972 as the Woodland Cultural Centre, a non-profit organization that serves to preserve and promote First Nations culture and heritage. As one of the few remaining Residential School buildings within Canada and the only site in Ontario offering guided tours until undergoing closure for refurbishment, the Mohawk Institute stands as a living testament to the tragic legacy of the residential school system in the country.



## We Need Your Help!

Since the restoration of the Mohawk Institute began in 2016, the building has transformed from a condemned structure grappling with deterioration and structural damage into a symbol of resilience and hope. This journey has been made possible through the tireless efforts of the WCC staff and Board of Directors, alongside a dedicated group of Survivors and visionary leaders from Six Nations. We have received invaluable support from community partners, all levels of government, generous donors from the individual, corporate, and non-profit sectors, as well as the skilled hands of Quartek Group architecture firm and Ultimate Construction, our general contractor.

The former Mohawk Institute is set to become a vital platform for truth-telling, healing, and reconciliation, honouring the resilience of Indigenous children who faced the harsh realities of the residential school system. WCC is committed to promoting Indigenous culture and fostering understanding through a multifaceted approach that includes historical exhibitions, community engagement, and education programming.

We are also excited to announce that for the fifth consecutive year, we are supported by The Dufresne-Ray Family Fund at Hamilton Community Foundation, which has generously pledged to match the first \$5,000 of donations received on Giving Tuesday. This incredible partnership amplifies the impact of your generosity!

As we look forward to a public reopening in 2025, the WCC is navigating some unforeseen financial hurdles. Despite challenges posed by the pandemic, inflation, and logistical issues, we have made significant progress in critical areas such as elevator installation, masonry repairs, and enhancements for accessibility.

However, to sustain this momentum and secure a bright future for the Cultural Centre, we need the support of our community. Your contributions are vital to continue this important work of healing and education, ensuring that the stories of resilience and courage are not only preserved but celebrated. Together, we can make a lasting impact!























## A Message of Thanks from our Volunteer Program Coordinator

If we haven't met yet, my name is Maichina and I'm the Volunteer Program Coordinator at Woodland Cultural Centre.

Since June, I have had the pleasure of building a new volunteer program for the Centre through generous funding from the Ontario Trillium Foundation. I've worked with dedicated Woodland staff, as well as reached out to community partners, to develop a program suited for WCC's current needs and dreams for the future.

The program currently takes two streams – daily roles and special events. Since my time with Woodland, I've been tasked with recruiting special event volunteers for four separate events (including a two-day festival!) and I could not be prouder or more grateful for the community members who have stepped forward to offer their time and expertise to support WCC's endeavours in bringing meaningful events and programming celebrating Hodinohsho:ni culture to life.

At the event on September 30th for National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, WCC saw about 1500 guests visit throughout the day – the largest event here since the pandemic! Our volunteers handled themselves with poise and good humour and worked hard to make sure the experiences of Woodland's guests, staff, and fellow volunteers were positive and meaningful. Our volunteers have been astounding at



all our events, but I wanted to use this example to highlight how they face challenging situations yet still make the Centre and all our experiences better.

We are building a team of amazing individuals – both locally and from surrounding cities – who are drawn to and connecting with the values and mission of WCC. It is an awesome thing to watch grow, and I'm so grateful to be a part of this program. Thank you for trusting me to work with you to develop these opportunities.
