Virtual Programming Description:

<u>Silent No More: A New Virtual Tour of the Former Mohawk Institute Indian Residential School:</u>

Duration: 1 - 1.5 hours

Grade Level: 7+

The tour of the former Mohawk Institute Residential School, gives the history of the school from when it opened in 1831, until it closed in 1970. Participants will see different rooms in the school, from the meeting room, the girls' and boys' dorms, the third floor, cafeteria, and various rooms in the basement. After the presentation participants will have the opportunity to ask questions or share comments with the Cultural Interpreter.

<u>Truth & Reconciliation Presentation:</u>

Duration: 1 - 1.5 hours

Grade Level: 7+

The goal of the Truth & Reconciliation presentation is about raising awareness of the tragic history of the residential school system. It examines the history and policies that lead to the creation of the residential schools, their legacies, and why truth and reconciliation is important.
